GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Psychology, the study of behavior, is both a science and a profession. As a science it attempts to answer, through research, basic questions about behavior. As a profession it attempts to apply the knowledge and skills derived through this research to the identification and solution of behavioral problems. Some of the branches of specialization in this field are clinical, social, counseling, developmental, experimental, educational, physiological, personality, and industrial psychology.

Common entry-level positions for those with a bachelor's degree include case management in programs serving the mentally ill, persons with retardation, substance abusers, and those referred to court services units. Residential services positions offer opportunities to enter social service as well. Advancement to administrative positions or to licensure requires an advanced degree in social work, counseling, or specialized areas such as retardation services. While some masters degrees and licenses lead to independent practice in psychology, a doctoral degree in clinical or counseling psychology is the norm. The PhD is also the norm for teaching at the college or university level.

Psychology has also proven to be a beneficial major for students planning a career in other professions such as law and medicine. Psychology majors have also found that their extensive training in methodology prepares them for research and assessment positions in research, business, and industry.

The job titles and hiring institutions which follow are meant to give you an idea of the careers available to psychology majors, however many other possibilities also exist. You are encouraged to explore all career paths that interest you.
