

- Ideal college town location, midway between Washington, D.C., and Richmond








The Classroom Experience



- No rigid formula
- Review each student individually
- Consider all factors







Important Factors

- Challenging program of high school study
- Strong academic performance
- Standardized testing
- Essays
- Extracurricular activities/special talents
- Letters of recommendation (1–2)

Financial Aid

A general term that includes **all** types of funding programs offered to a student to help pay tuition, fees, and living expenses.

Types:

- Gift Aid
 - Grants
 - Scholarships
- Self Help
 - Loans (for parents and students)
 - Jobs

Sources:

- Federal and state governments
- Colleges and universities
- Private organizations





Gift Aid-Grants & Scholarships

- Federal grants (Pell, SEOG) for students with the highest needs: EFC less than \$5,082.
- State grants require need and resident status.
- UMW merit scholarships awarded by Admissions.
- Scholarships from private donors (local businesses, foundations, churches, employers, clubs. etc.)





Federal Student Loans


Federal Direct Student Loans

- Repay after college at 3.4%, 6.8% (fixed) 2012-13 interest rates
- \$5,500, \$6,500, \$7,500, \$7,500 (annual limits) *Available regardless of need.*

Perkins Loans

- Repay after college at 5% fixed
- Up to \$5000 per undergraduate year
- Limited availability: high need required





Parent Loans

- Federal PLUS
- Borrow up to (costs minus aid)
- Need not required, credit based
- Requires FAFSA
- Repay begins in 60 days after loan is disbursed into student account
- Home equity?





Other Loans

Private/Alternative Loans

- Credit based
- May require a credit-worthy co-signer and may possibly lower the interest rate
- Deferment, forbearance, and other benefits are not guaranteed



Student Employment

- Federal Work-Study
- Institutional Student Employment
- Wages are paid to students directly, rather than being applied against charges on the student's account.
- Minimum wage is paid and hours are limited to 10 hours per week.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid

(FAFSA) www.fafsa.ed.gov

- A standard form that collects demographic and financial information about the student and family to determine need
- May be filed electronically or using paper form
- Available in English and Spanish
- Aid awarded through the Office of Financial Aid is needbased
- Requires the FAFSA to be filed in order to determine need
- Expected Family Contribution (EFC) is used to determine need. Cost of Attendance minus EFC = Need



Expected Family Contribution

- EFC is calculated by a federal formula according to your FAFSA
- Colleges do not calculate EFC
- Your EFC is the same at every school (because it's YOURS)

Before Beginning a FAFSA

Get organized!
To simplify the application process, gather required documents and other information ahead of time.

- Determine Your
 Dependency Status
- FAFSA on the Web Worksheet
- Search for School Codes
- Students & Parents Apply For a PIN
- Check Application Deadline Dates

Filling Out a FAFSA

Fill out the application! The FAFSA contains questions that ask about you, your financial information, your school plans, and more.

- Fill Out Your FAFSA
- Open Your Saved FAFSA or Correction Application
- Sign Electronically With Your PIN

View your results online! You can check the status of your application, make corrections to a processed FAFSA, and get other information.

- Check Status of a Submitted FAFSA or Print Signature Page
- Make Corrections to a Processed FAFSA
- Add or Delete a School Code
- View and Print Your Student Aid Report







Completing Your FAFSA

- Student and parent use their PINs to sign the FAFSA. PINs obtained at www.pin.ed.gov
- Complete the FAFSA leaving no 'blanks'
- Use data retrieval option or a tax return transcript will be needed from IRS if selected for verification






Principles of Needs Analysis

- Parents have the primary responsibility for paying for their child's education
- Students also have a responsibility to contribute
- Family's estimated ability to pay educational costs must be evaluated in equitable and consistent manner, recognizing that special circumstances may affect family's ability to pay

Special Circumstances

- Cannot report on FAFSA
- Send Special Circumstance Request Form to financial aid office with documentation
- Committee will review special circumstances
 - Request additional documentation
 - Decisions are final and cannot

- Change in employment status
- Medical expenses not covered by insurance
- Natural or manmade disasters
- Unusual dependent care expenses For more info visit:

Important Dates

Filing and submissions deadlines determine maximum aid eligibility.

March 1- File FAFSA on or before this date May 15- Submit required documents for verification
